Thank you for your interest in the post of Painter with Historic Environment Scotland, based at Edinburgh Castle. This is a permanent and pensionable appointment.

The successful applicant will assist the Monument Conservation Unit (MCU) with the day-to-day painting and decorating works to monuments based within the region.

About us

We are the lead body for Scotland's historic environment; a charity dedicated to the advancement of heritage, culture, education and environmental protection. We're at the forefront of researching and understanding the historic environment and addressing the impact of climate change on its future. We investigate and record architectural and archaeological sites and landscapes across Scotland and care for more than 300 properties of national importance. We have a People Strategy, which is an overarching strategy to ensure we support and develop staff within the organisation.

Overview of the post and information about the team

The Conservation & Works Group for Edinburgh Region including Edinburgh Castle, Palace of Holyrood house, Holyrood Royal Park and Gardens, Bute House, Longmore House, and Trinity House. The unit is responsible for carrying out routine and preventative conservation maintenance to the monuments within the region.

The MCU Teams are generally based at two main locations – Edinburgh Castle and St Ann's Maltings at Holyrood but remain fluid and merge when large scale works demand. The post holder will work with all trades under the supervision of MCU Line Management to ensure customer satisfaction for both internal and external customers.

The applicant will be an integral part of the MCU Team who deliver the annual programme of works and provide support to visitor services & Royal Household ensuring that Edinburgh Castle & Holyrood Palace are maintained to a five-star level.

All trade persons are responsible for the PPE & resources that are provided to them by HES.

Key responsibilities, duties, and objectives

As a Painter you will join the Monument Conservation Unit (MCU) team within the Operations Directorate, which looks after the care and conservation of the 336 Properties in HES' care.

The MCU team is made of almost 400 professional, craft skilled and works staff, divided into 4 regional teams based in 27 depots across Scotland.

You will be based in Edinburgh Region Conservation Team (MCU) and will report directly to Steven Lumsden based at the Edinburgh Castle site. You will work across properties within the region closely with the wider MCU team and colleagues to make an effective contribution to the maintenance of HES sites including PICS and other buildings.

- Knowledge & experience of current conservation practices and techniques relating to historic buildings and monuments
- Health & Safety on construction sites
- Experience of having contributed to or supported working together as part of a group of people or a team.

Desirable requirements:

- Ensure an excellent customer experience by maintaining HES properties to a high standard.
- Work as required with community stakeholders as part of HES outreach programmes, providing insight on your role and expertise
- Will carry out painting safely and to a consistently high standard to ensure a positive & safe visitor experience
- Carry out conservation painting and decoration using traditional techniques and materials including oil-based paints, traditional wall coverings and gilding in Properties in Care.
- Carry out painting work on conservation/refurbishment/maintenance projects in visitor, exhibition, and retail areas.
- Experienced in all aspects of painting and surface preparations. The job holder will be required to prepare and apply surface finishes to wood, metal, internal/external surfaces to a high level of finish and to work to agreed specifications.
- Prepare the properties for high profile visits or events which may take place regularly.
- Undertake works to a high standard of finish to ensure all buildings in are maintained/presented to the highest standard.
- Carry specialist finishes such as gold leaf and graining.
- Work collaboratively alongside other members of the MCU and Visitor & Community teams.
- Provide training and mentoring for apprentice painters where applicable.
- Attend toolbox talks and daily briefings applicable to the works being carried out.
